These activities of both our staff and postgraduate students have enabled the SCD to fulfil its mission in being an institution where the high calibre of its research contributes directly to, and enhances, the teaching of Theology and its related disciplines, and where the ongoing dialogue between faith and reason is encouraged. The Sydney College of Divinity is committed to advancing, preserving and disseminating knowledge that will benefit the community and its churches.

You will see in the following pages that 2006 was again a most productive year where the results of the research by staff have been published in a large number of learned articles and books. The College's progress here is of the highest order. Of importance too is the contribution that our members make at seminars and at conferences, through consultancies and occasional lectures, and by participating in church, government, industry and other professional bodies. These efforts and initiatives are even more appreciated as they have taken place in a year in which the faculty members were immersed in tasks associated with the College's review and reaccreditation processes.

The College has five higher-degrees by research, and this year saw the first completion by a PhD candidate. The thesis topics and titles of all of our candidates appear in this report. Graduates from our doctoral programs emerge with a research qualification that equips them for teaching positions in tertiary institutions throughout the world. Many graduates will also use their skills to contribute to ministry formation and to creative reflection on the practice of ministry. In this way the College continues its task of preparing leaders and ministers who are well-qualified to build the church of the future.

I am most grateful for the energies and insights of the Director of Research within my Office, and for the indefatigable work of the Research Committee and its associated bodies, who have facilitated, guided and encouraged. I have read with pleasure this report of publications and other research ventures, as well as a wide variety of related professional activities, and I commend it for wide distribution.
