## POLICY ON CROSS-STREAMING

Cross-streaming refers to the simultaneous teaching of units from two or more separate courses accredited to different Higher Education institutions.

From time to time an SCD Member Institution may also be approved to deliver also courses accredited to another Higher Education Provider, whether itself or a third party. This policy pertains to such occasional situations.

1. The SCD will not tolerate the teaching of students enrolled in an SCD course at the same time, in the same place, and by the same teacher as the teaching of students enrolled in a non-SCD course.
2. The SCD will act immediately to stop such activity detected in any Member Institution and will take all possible steps to amend the situation for the students concerned, having regard for the SCD Student Support and Welfare Policy.

### **In addition:**

3. The SCD will not tolerate multi-streaming of SCD students enrolled in different SCD courses except as agreed with NSW DET in the SCD Policy to Phase Out the Practice of Multi-Streaming Undergraduate and Postgraduate Courses in the Sydney College of Divinity. From 2010 onwards, this means that multi-streaming is accepted only in respect of foundational course units, on condition that such course units are conducted without common tutorials and with clearly differentiated course unit outlines, outcomes, assessment, and reading requirements.
